

Degraded urbanization. The migration of population for search of employment and education from rural areas to urban centers caused the population explosion in urban areas. Technological developments. At the present time the nature of productive activities is changing rapidly. The use of



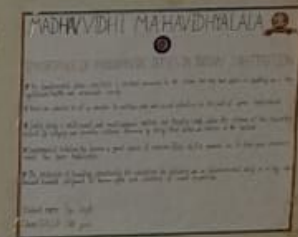
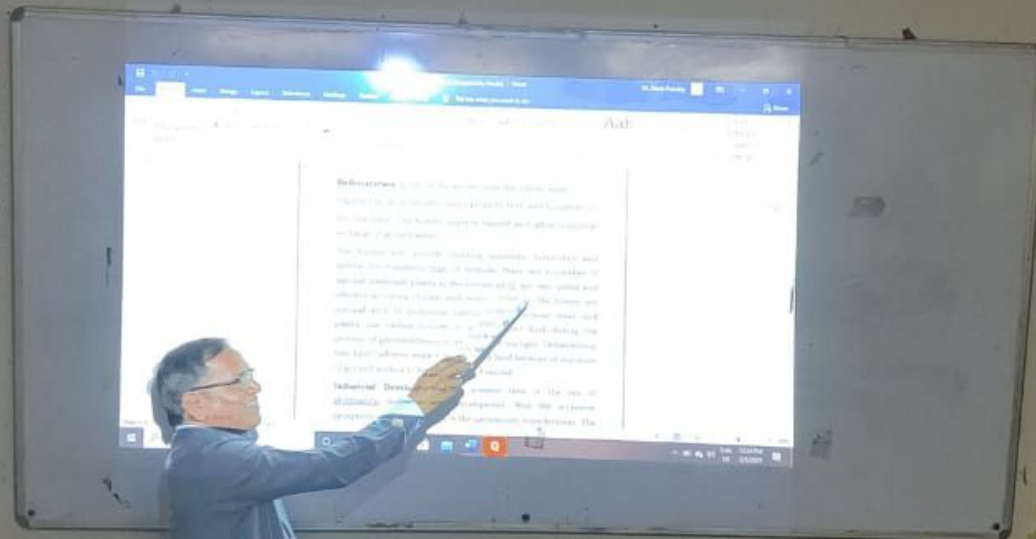
