
Functions & Responsibilities:

Madhav Vidyavihar Mahavidyalayam (MVVM) is NALAC-B+ Grade Institution which is affiliated by Swami University & approved by Bar Council of India and by Madhya Bharat Shiksha Samiti. The college imparts quality education and continuously makes strides in upholding quality practices and meeting all the standards laid by various apex bodies. As a result, the college has received several accolades, a few of those are mentioned here. College certifies its journey of quality education. The college is continuously trying to secure NIRF rankings.

Education is a collaborative project and MVVM deeply believes in this dictum. It has signed MOUs with several foreign universities, colleges and organizations. The college focuses on student careers and assists them by providing 50 days training by the advocates with whom we have signed MOU along with this MVVM organized "Lecture Series" and free coaching classes for C.I.A.D.P.O, Law officers . An exclusive Competency Development Cell (CDC) with qualified and experienced faculty is formed for the same. In addition, a dedicated 'Training and Placement' (TCP) team works for providing expert guidance and scheduling placement meetings such that the students explore and face the competition in the industry. The college makes concerted efforts to encourage and promote its faculty towards research and developmental activities. We organize various workshops, FDPs, Seminars and certificate courses, MAVA promotes its faculty to attend programmes conducted by UGC, HRDc, to make their research part strong.

The college supports the faculty in research activities by providing necessary financial so that the teachers can guide the students on research work. As a result, the faculty towards knowledge creation impacted their research outcomes by way of high quality technical publications of books.

The college has also conducted several national and international conferences. Student grooming and providing wholesome education is the core objective of the college. Students are exposed to art technological trends and educational practices. 


