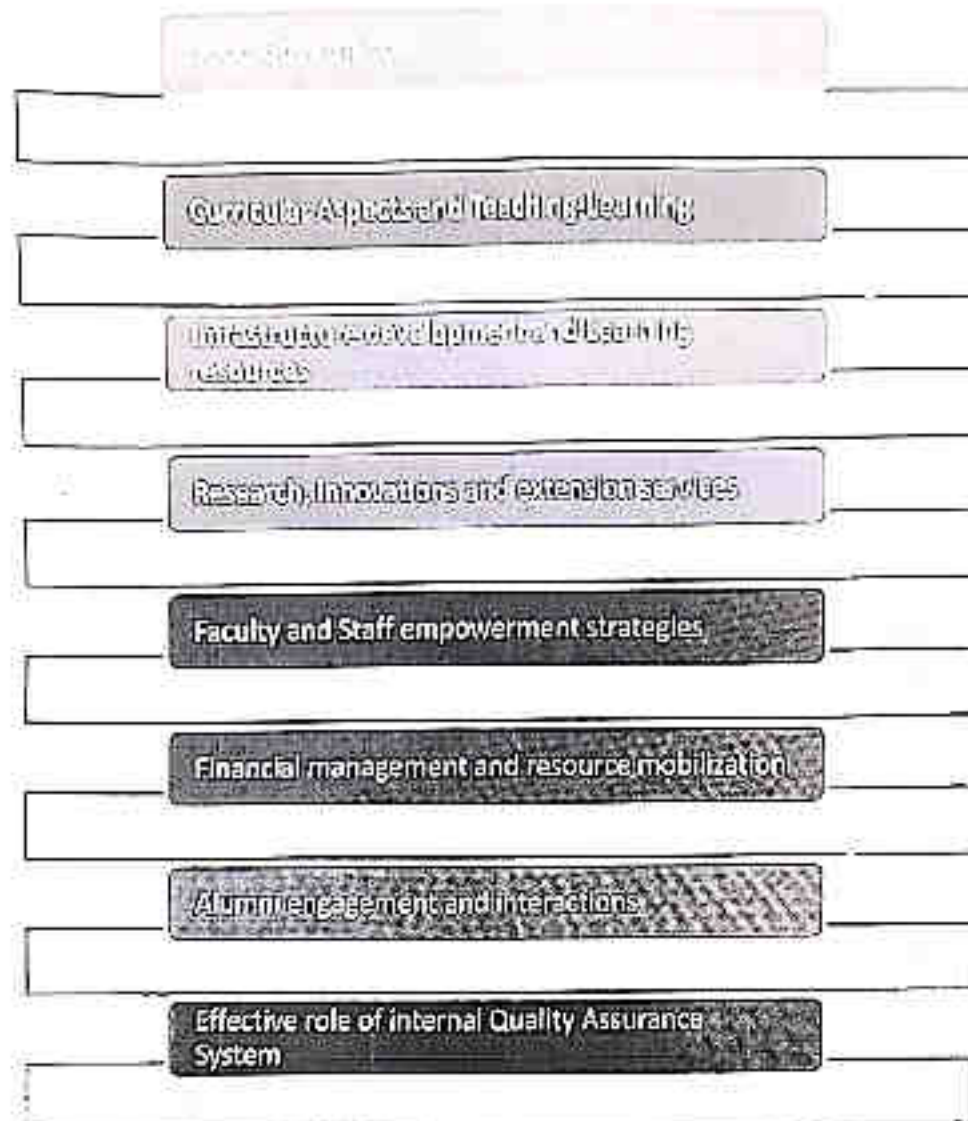

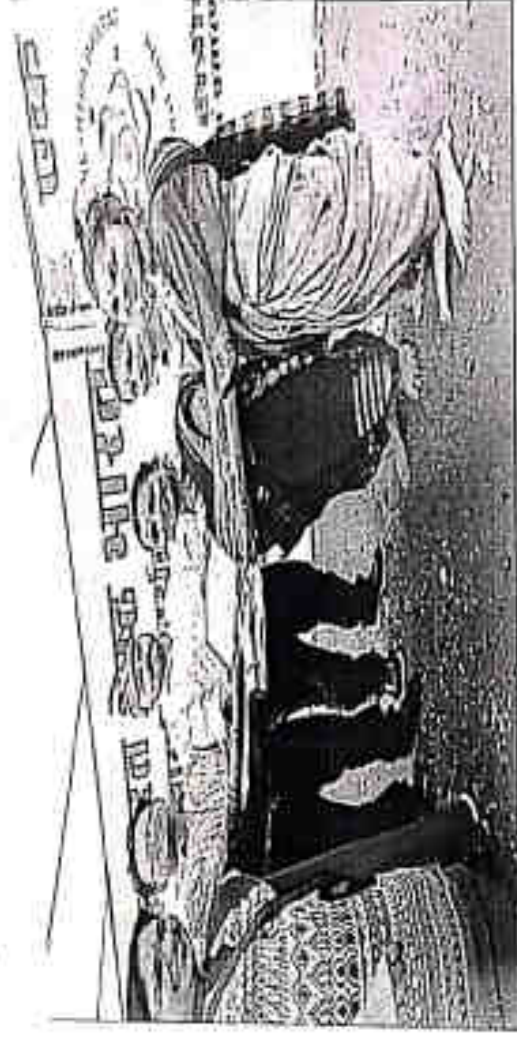

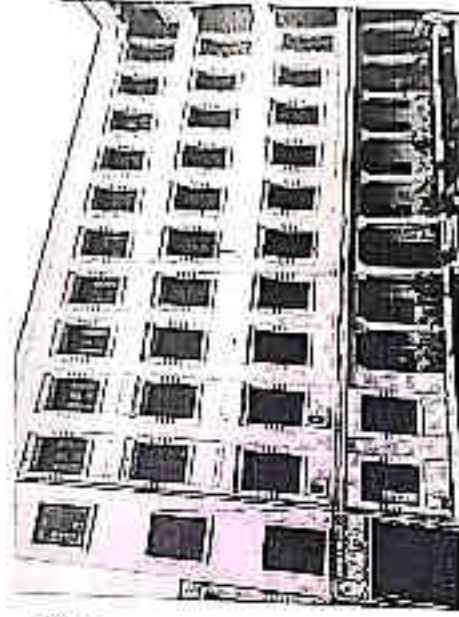
### Functions & Responsibilities:

The college is an private, unaided, Co-educational Institution affiliated to Jiwaji University, Gwalior and Bar Council of India established in the year 2005.

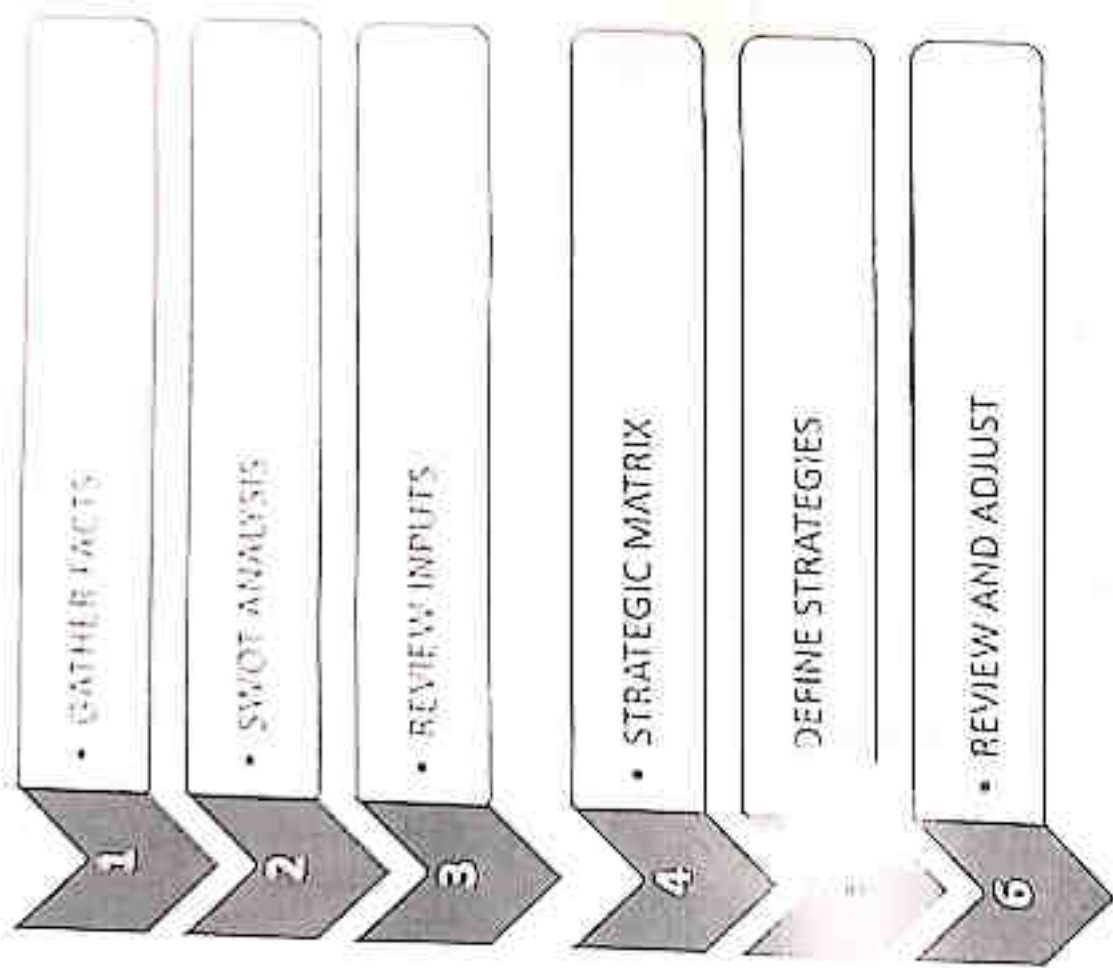

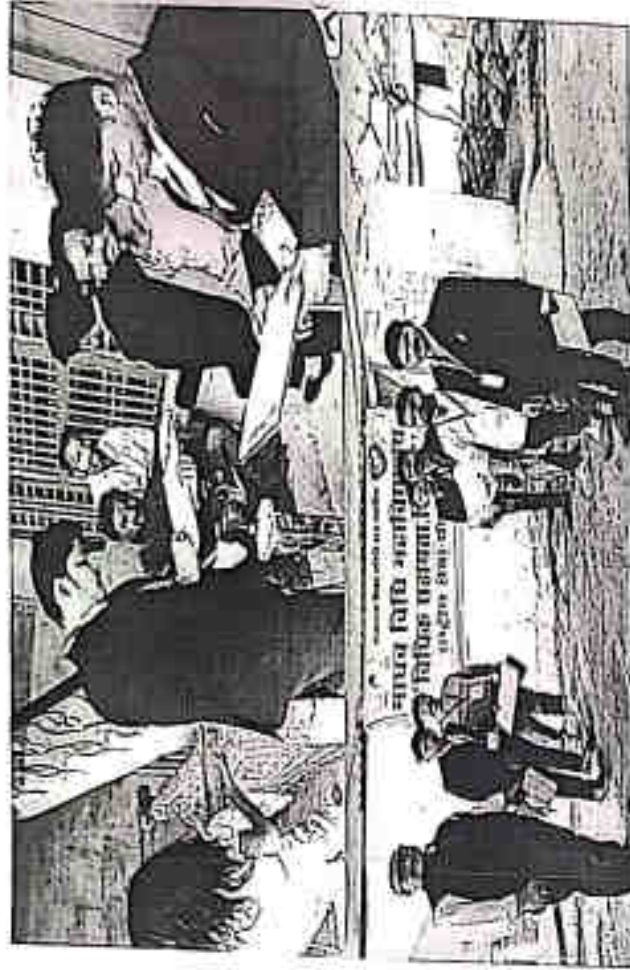

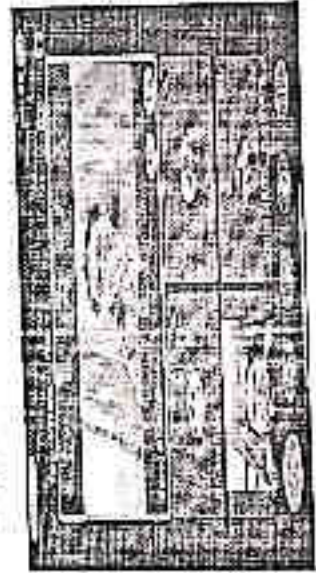
